Paul Stoffels, MD

Chief Scientific Officer, Worldwide Chairman, Pharmaceuticals, Johnson & Johnson

As Chief Scientific Officer Dr Stoffels works with R&D leaders across Johnson & Johnson to set the enterprise-wide innovation agenda and is a member of the Johnson & Johnson Executive Committee. He chairs the company's Worldwide Research & Development Council, and provides oversight to Johnson & Johnson Innovation, and for safety for all of the company's products worldwide. He has over 20 years of global health and pharmaceutical experience and oversees teams across the Janssen Pharmaceutical Companies of Johnson & Johnson discovering and developing treatments for unmet medical needs across a range of therapeutic areas. Dr Stoffels studied medicine and infectious diseases and tropical medicine in Belgium and began his career as a physician in Africa focusing on HIV and neglected disease research.



Prof. Alexander von Gabain

Deputy Vice-Chancellor for Innovation and Commercial Outreach, Karolinska Institutet

Alexander von Gabain obtained his Ph.D. in Genetics at the University of Heidelberg and held a post-doctorate position at the Stanford University. In the 1980s and 1990s, he was Professor at the University of Umeå and at Karolinska Institutet, as well as an advisor to pharmaceutical and biotech companies. As Chair of Microbiology at the University of the Vienna between 1992-1998 he helped establish the public-private partnership between the Vienna Biocenter and Boehringer Ingelheim. In addition to issuing numerous publications and patents, Professor von Gabain has co-founded a number of biotech firms, including Intercell AG In 1998 and has served on the Governing Board of the European Institutet of Innovation and Technology (EIT), of which he was the chairman from 2011 until last year.



Prof. Johan van der Lei

MD, PhD, Chair of the Department of Medical Informatics, Erasmus University Medical Center Rotterdam

Johan van der Lei studied medicine in the Free University of Amsterdam. He received his PhD cum laude in 1991 from the Erasmus University Rotterdam on a thesis dealing with the architecture of clinical decision support systems. In 2000 he became Professor of Medical Informatics and Chairman of the Department of Medical Informatics in the Erasmus MC - University Medical Center in Rotterdam, the Netherlands. His initial research focused on understanding the requirements for successful introduction of information and communication technology in medical practice. Currently, his interests are on the development, evaluation, use, and impact of computer-based patient records.



Dr Jeroen van der Veer

Chairman of the Supervisory Boards of Koninklijke Philips Electronics N.V. and ING Group N.V.

Jeroen van der Veer was appointed as Chief Executive of Royal Dutch Shell plc in 2004, leading Shell through major change, simplifying governance and organization, while clarifying accountabilities. After his retirement in 2009 he continued to serve as a Non-Executive Director until May 2013. He also served as Vice-Chairman and Senior Independent Director of Unilever and World President of the Society of Chemical Industry between 2002-2004. In 2012, Jeroen became Chairman of the Rotterdam Climate Initiative and Chairman of the Supervisory Council of the Technical University of Delft in 2013. He also currently holds various roles in numerous foundations and charities.

Dr Daria Tataj

Founder and CEO, Tataj Innovation

Dr Tataj is a founder and CEO of Tataj Innovation, a consultancy that helps design innovation policies. She is an alumna of the World Economic Forum Global Agenda Council and Forum's expert on collaborative innovation, and has played an instrumental role in launching the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT). In 2006, Daria was recognized by the US Department of State and Fortune Magazine as one of 17 emerging global women business leaders and later became a founding President of Vital Voices Poland, and was honored with the title 'Creator of Innovation 2014' in Poland. She is the author of a forthcoming book 'Innovation and Entrepreneurship: A Growth Model for Europe beyond the Crisis' and regularly acts as guest speaker at various events globally.
